**COMPETITION FORMAT**

- To be played under the Rules of Golf as laid down by the Royal & Ancient Golf Club of St.Andrews and in conjunction with the Local Rules of Royal Wellington Golf Club on the day
- Play will be over 72 holes of Strokeplay.
- The Men's and Women's Championships will be regarded as separate events
- Prizes will be awarded on Gross & Nett over 72 holes and over 36 holes each day
- One prize per player
- Entry Fee is \$80.00 and includes lunch on both days of competition.
- A maximum of 90 entries will be accepted
- Entries close on 3<sup>rd</sup> September and the draw will be distributed to all Clubs and published on the website by Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2010.
- The WGI reserves the right to decide the entries that are accepted but prefers to finalise a field of the lowest handicapped 70 men and 20 women. The events are the qualifying rounds for the Wellington Matchplay Championship as follows;  
Women's Matchplay and Men's Matchplay will take place at Wainuiomata Golf Club on 2 / 3 October 2010  
Qualifiers for the Matchplay are expected to confirm their availability for that event. There will be 16 qualifiers for both the Men's and women's Matchplay

## **WELLINGTON GOLF ASSOCIATION 72 HOLE STROKE-PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP ROYAL WELLINGTON GOLF CLUB on 11 & 12 SEPTEMBER 2010.**

### Rules and conditions

- The Tournament is open to Amateurs who are playing men or women members of a registered Golf Club. A limited number of professional golfers may be invited to play in the tournament at the discretion of Wellington Golf Incorporated .
- The Match Committee shall have the power to refuse the entry of any person without being required to give reasons for such refusals.
- The Match Committee reserve the right to accept late entries to meet the field requirements.
- The Match Committee reserves the right to set the number of entrants dependant on the handicap levels
- The Match Committee shall have the power to vary the programme in the event of bad weather.
- The rules shall be those of the Royal & Ancient Golf Club of St.Andrews and the local rules of the Royal Wellington Golf Club at the time.
- It is a condition of play that only those brands of balls published in the current Approved lists of balls which have been tested by the R & A or USGA and found to conform with the Rules, may be used. Similarly, only drivers that have been approved as conforming to the Rules may be used. The penalty for use of balls or drivers not approved is disqualification.
- Starting Times : Rule 6-3a provides: "The player must start at the time established by the Match Committee". The penalty for a breach of Rule 6-3a is disqualification. However it is a condition of the Championship that, 'if the player arrives at his starting point, ready to play, within 5 minutes of his starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strokes. Penalty for lateness beyond five minutes is disqualification'.
- Any dispute or protest must be lodged within 15 minutes of the completion of the round and the Match Committee's decision shall be final.
- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by a sudden death play-off on the day. All other ties will be shared.
- No competitor will receive more than one prize.
- The entry fee includes lunch on both days of the championship.
- If balloted out of the initial draw, the entry fee will be refunded.
- Motorised carts are not permitted to be used by players on the course

### **LECK CUP**

- The Leck Cup may only be competed for by teams of three male players from the same Club of Wellington Golf Incorporated over rounds 3 & 4.
- The winner is the team with the best combined 3 gross scores. In the event of a tie the highest score recorded in the 4th round of each team will be disregarded, should a tie still exist the highest score recorded by each team in the 3rd round will also be disregarded. Should a tie still exist the Tournament Committee shall have the power to introduce such method of elimination to find a winner.
- Team composition must be in the hands of the General Manager of Wellington Golf Incorporated before the commencement of the first round

### **REGISTRATION**

Competitors are expected to report to the Tournament Controller at the Royal Wellington Golf Club **15 minutes prior to their appointed 1st round tee off time.**
