HOSTING

Prior to Event	Two weeks prior: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Ensure Management, Caterers, Greenkeepers, Committees are aware of forthcoming event .- Consult with General Manager WGI & provide assistance as agreed.- Appoint Tournament Committee- Assess potential number of Players and expected time on the course.- Determine Start time & Starting Tees. Host Clubs are entitled to ensure that their course and facilities are utilised in the most time effective way Unless justified by the numbers entered in the competition, or the club chooses to, it may be unnecessary to close the course.
Tournament Committee	Provide Registration Area with Draws, Card, Course Handicap Charts Appoint Starters, Marshalls and Spotters Arrange Scoring area/Scorers
Local Rules	Any not already on Club Cards <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Simple (eg placing) display on Notice Board;- More complicated arrange for printed version to either be attached to cards or to be given to players. (It is unnecessary for Starters to provide all local rule information to each group of players on the tee).
Cards	It is recommended that cards be <ul style="list-style-type: none">- available on the Starting Tees;- pre-printed (after handicap roll over date). It is the Host Club's responsibility to process all cards promptly

HOSTING INTERCLUB

Tees & Tee Times	The starting times and the number of tees to be used is to be determined by the Host Clubs. Those times and the number of tees to be used should be communicated by the club to Wellington Golf at least 14 days prior to the scheduled match. Wellington Golf will then advise the participating clubs.
Team Sheets	Check that these have arrived at the club – follow up if needed Add Course Handicaps to team sheets
Hospitality	Clubs may wish to have pre match refreshments available for purchase when players arrive at the course. It is unnecessary to provide refreshments at the “turn” or through the course
Starting Tees/Times	Starters should be at their Starting Tees 10 minutes prior to tee off and should endeavour to keep the matches to time Late Starting: If a player arrives at her starting tee, ready to play, within 5 minutes after her starting time the penalty for failing to start on time is loss of the first hole (Rule 6-3). Penalty for lateness after 5 minutes is disqualification In the event of unusual circumstances (traffic being unduly delayed because of an accident) host clubs should use their discretion and may start matches which are ready to proceed.
Scoring	Transfer to WGI Results Sheets – Match/Player details – Previous points (available on WGI Website) Score Results – 1 point for win; 1/2 point for all square; Record any defaults or disqualification on sheet and give 1 point to “winner” Check properly completed cards and confirm receipt on result sheet (Deduct one point from players team score for unreturned cards.)
Cards	Process for Handicapping purposes Note: Cards which are uncompleted or unable to be read should be returned to the players for completion/correction.
Results	A set of Result Sheets must be available to each participating team and WGI within 5 days of the completion of each round. (If clubs have the technology, result sheets may be scanned and forwarded electronically.)

Slow Play	The host club is responsible for monitoring the Pace of Play and should appoint officials to monitor the pace of play. These officials are to be empowered to address any pace of play issues. Players who lose ground should be asked to make up the ground. Players who are consistently warned for slow play may be disqualified and could be disqualified from participating in further rounds.
Inclement Weather	Rounds should proceed unless the Course Superintendent/Course Management closes the course. Depending upon the projected weather forecast and any other commitments the club has for course usage on the day, it may be possible to delay the start. If Postponement occurs then it is the responsibility of the Host Club to provide - a Postponement Notice on Newstalk ZB (phone 04 472 1035) prior to 7.00am if possible; - to endeavour to contact Teams who may be in transit; - to notify the General Manager WGI.
Course Unplayable:	Suspension of Play. The Host Club may suspend play if the course becomes unplayable after commencement of play. (Refer Rule 33(d) Delay will be for one a maximum of one hour. If play cannot resume because of course conditions, all games shall be abandoned and replayed over 18 holes at a later date. 18 hole matches cannot be reduced to nine hole matches.
Reserve Days	If play is postponed the Host Club should liaise with the General Manager WGI to arrange play on one of the Reserve Days.
Injuries	If a player cannot complete a match due to injury or illness the result should be determined from the last completed hole. Lansdowne: Refer Lansdowne rules regarding substitute player for pm round.
Disputes	In the In the event of any dispute arising on the day of play which requires a prompt decision, it shall be decided by the Tournament Committee of the Host club along with any Wellington Golf Inc delegate present who has not been involved in the day's event. (Refer also Rule 2.5)
Teams short of Players	Host clubs may use their discretion as to the best way to manage a "two" in a field of fours. This may involve starting the match from another tee or combining two "two's" from unrelated matches to facilitate the pace of play on the course.

Other Club Responsibilities/Information in regard to their Interclub Teams

Trophies for players with the most Individual Wins in each Interclub

Clubs wishing to nominate one of their players for these trophies must do so on the relevant form (available on WGI website.)

For Lansdowne the nomination must be ready for submission on the day of the Final Round (the Trophy is awarded on that day)

For Pennants (one trophy for all pennant players), **Mary Alward/Tuakana** and **OTS** the nominations must be sent to WGI within 7 days of the conclusion of the Rounds. Matches won by default will be awarded one point.

In the event of a tie, a count back will be done on number of holes up.

If a tie remains after the count back the trophy is held jointly.

If there is an uneven number of rounds in any competition, an apportionment of each player's results from all rounds will apply.

Lansdowne & OTS Division winners are established at the end of the Final Round Pennants and Mary Alward/Tuakana

- Establish the winners of each Section – if appropriate refer establishing winners when points are tied

Mary Alward – the Section winners only contest the Final

Pennants (Silver & Bronze) – The winning and the runner-up teams from each Section play off (winners v winners; runner-up v runner up) to determine the 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed teams in District Pennants.

Establishing Interclub Winners when points are tied.

The team which wins each Competition is the team with the most points.

Should team scores be tied at the completion of the final rounds, the winning team will be the one which won the match between the tied teams. If the result is still tied then a count back of holes won between the teams concerned will apply.

If there is still a tie, the two teams will contest the Pennants Final and play off with the winners of the other Section.

If there should be three or 4 teams tied on the same score at the end of the rounds, there will be a 3 or 4 way play off.

PLAYERS RESPONSIBILITIES/REQUIREMENTS

Handicap

Players taking part in WGI Fixtures must have a current NZG Handicap Index.

Players must know their current handicap index and course handicap prior to tee off. While the Host Club may enter the Course Handicaps onto the Team Sheets/Cards, it is the player's responsibility to check that the details are correct.

Club Membership

Unless stated otherwise, all players taking part in the Wellington District Women's Interclub Competitions must be a Financial Playing Member of a Member Club.

(Playing Member means any member, including Junior Members, with playing rights, but does not include Country Members (or similar) of that Club.)

A player who is a Playing Member of more than one Member Club may represent one club in one competition and another club in a different competition

Unless stated otherwise, the Handicap Divisions for all competition are:

Silver: NZG Handicap Indices up to 18.4

Floating Handicaps- Teams short of players in the relevant handicap division:

Floating Handicap Range Indices 17.4 – 19.5 inclusive

If, and only if, a Silver and/or a Bronze Pennant team cannot field a full team because it is short of players with indices in the required range, it may include up to **2 players** in its team from outside the Division.

Players who are from within the Floating Handicap Range will play off the **course handicap corresponding with of their own index.**

ie: A Bronze Division player with a handicap index 18.5 to 19.5 inclusive may play in the Silver Division; a Silver Division player with a handicap index of 17.4 to 18.4 may play in the Bronze Division; and all such players will play off their **corresponding Course Handicap.**

If a Silver team continues to have shortages because there are either no Bronze Players, or insufficient Bronze Players, available within the FHR range, it may include Bronze players from outside the Floating Handicap Range – ie on Indices of 19.6 or greater. Such bronze players, **regardless of their personal handicap index**, when playing in the Silver Division must play off the course handicap corresponding with the maximum in the Floating Handicap Range ie **19.5**

All players will play in order of their NZG Index.

If a team continues to have insufficient players it should play a shortened team.

Number of players in each team

6 players.

Multiple entries and/or combined/amalgamated club teams

Clubs may enter more than one team in any Division. When that occurs each team from the same club will be drawn in different Sections of the same competition.

If a club has insufficient of its own members, it may combine/amalgamate with another club(s) to form a combined team in either Division (see requirements for amalgamated teams in *Rules for all Wellington District Women's Interclub Matchplay* section)

Finals

The winning team from each Section will compete in the Final.

- In the event of a tied result in any Section the winning team will be the winner of the match between the two teams concerned.

- If that match was halved, a count back of singles matches will apply

- If the count back still results in a tie, a count back of holes won shall apply.

The Finals should be played on a neutral course.

Team members competing in the Finals must be drawn from the players who have participated in Section Play.

Where there are two Sections, the winning team in each Section will play off for The Winner & Runner-up Trophy; the two teams which are second in Section play will play off for 3rd & 4th places.

In the event of a team tie, a count back of holes won in the Final will apply. If there is still a tie the trophies will be held jointly.

Where there are three Sections, the winning team from each Section will play off "simultaneously" ie. The number 1 players from each team will play each other at the same time and so on for all team players.

It is recommended that each player has a caddie.

Silver will be presented at the conclusion of the Pennants Final

Bronze will be presented at the Field Day

Pennants Field Day:

There will be a Field Day for the Bronze Pennants and, subject to the number of Reserve days required to complete the Silver Competitions, there may also be a Field Day for the Silver Pennants.
